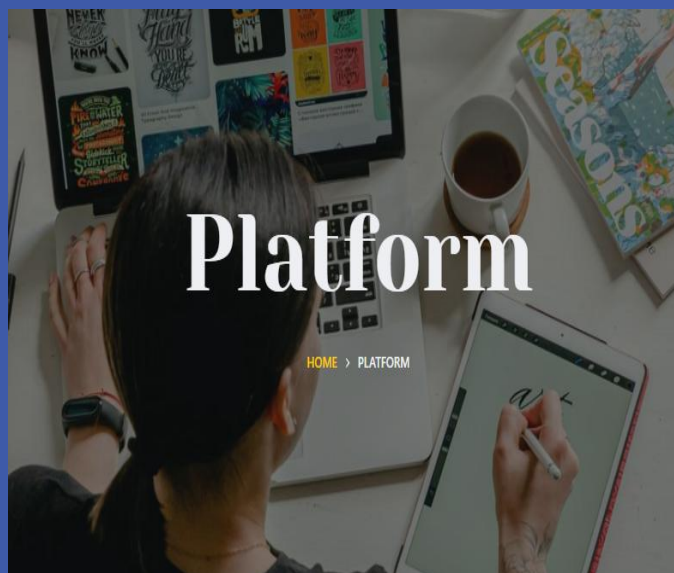


The STEMazing Women Platform Is Now Live!

We're thrilled to announce that the STEMazing Women Digital Academy is now fully accessible to learners across Europe! This inclusive and interactive platform is the heart of our project—designed to empower young women aged 18–25 from rural and marginalized communities by equipping them with STEM-based life skills. Our online academy offers a flexible, user-friendly, and multilingual environment, breaking down barriers to participation and allowing women to access quality education no matter where they are. The content is carefully tailored to their needs, combining self-guided learning, interactive content, and mentorship from inspiring women in STEM..



What's Inside the Training Program?

The training is structured in **5 themed weeks**, each focusing on key competencies that enhance employability and personal growth:

Week 1: Introduction to STEM and Life Skills

Participants explore how STEM intersects with everyday life and how it can be used to solve real-world challenges. Focus is placed on building confidence and understanding the broader value of STEM beyond technical careers.

Week 2: Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving in STEM

Learners build their analytical thinking, decision-making, and creative problem-solving skills through hands-on activities and interactive scenarios that mirror real-life STEM contexts.

Week 3: Practical Applications of STEM

This week introduces participants to tools and technologies in STEM, such as basic coding, digital tools, or data interpretation, and explores how these skills can be applied in different career paths.

Week 4: Communication and Collaboration in STEM

A key employability module that enhances team communication, digital collaboration, and presentation skills, encouraging participants to work together across borders, languages, and backgrounds.

Week 5: Empowerment through STEM and Future Opportunities

The final week focuses on building a personal growth mindset, exploring career pathways in STEM, and preparing participants to become **change agents** in their own communities.

All modules are supported by **quizzes, reflection tasks, video testimonials from women role models**, and mentorship opportunities.

The partnership met in Sofia, Bulgaria

Dates: 13–14 March 2025

The STEMAzing Women consortium met in Sofia for its second transnational meeting, hosted by **Association Walk Together**. The gathering brought together all project partners to reflect on the implementation progress, align on the next phase, and ensure the high-quality delivery of the Digital Academy and piloting activities.

Key discussion and decisions from the meeting included:

- Evaluation of technical performance, user feedback, and accessibility features.
- Finalization of schedules and participant selection in each partner country for local and online piloting.
- Exchange of best practices for improving module content, user engagement, and cultural adaptability.
- Agreement on the structure for online mentoring and inspirational sessions led by STEM role models.
- Development of outreach strategies targeting VET institutions, women's organizations, and youth networks.



The meeting highlighted the dedication of all partners and their commitment to co-creating inclusive, high-quality learning tools for young women across Europe.

What's Next?

In the months ahead, partners will begin sharing the results of the training pilot, including impact data, testimonials, and recommendations for improving access to STEM education among marginalized young women. A series of community events will be organized in each country to promote the project outcomes, connect participants with role models, and celebrate their achievements.
